ALLELUIA! CHRIST IS RISEN! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia! That ancient exchange of greetings on Easter morning says so much and so is often used throughout the entire Easter season. You are welcome to our Service this Sunday as the Easter Season continues. We are glad that you are here and invite you to be present with us each and every Sunday. You are also welcome to any of our congregation's activities, to seek spiritual direction from our pastor, and to make Pilgrim Lutheran Church your church home.

AS YOU ARRIVE, please move down the pew towards the wall, in order to leave room for others. If you arrive late, please wait for an appropriate time to enter the sanctuary, such as during a hymn. Please also remember to turn off your cell phones and/or any other electronic devices. Thank you!

LAY-LED SERVICES: Although the budget passed by the Voters Assembly does provide for pastors to fill-in when Pastor Galler is away, Rev. Adler, who usually fills-in, was not able to be present today, but, upon the Board of Elders' request, he has provided a sermon to be read today as part of a lay-led Matins service. Such lay-leading of Matins and reading of a pastor-authored sermon do not go against either Augsburg Confession Article V, regarding the Office of the Holy Ministry, or Article XIV, regarding only ordained pastors' preaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments.

ORDER OF SERVICE: To your right you will find today's order of service. The right side of that outline indicates from where the item listed comes in the hymnal, *Lutheran Service Book*, with the Psalms towards the front, its liturgical pages towards the middle, and its hymns towards the back. The △ symbol before a hymn stanza indicates that it especially gives glory to the Triune God; we stand before singing the stanza and, in most cases, conclude the stanza by singing "Amen.", if an "Amen" is not already included.

BEFORE THE SERVICE: As you greet and visit with one another, please be sensitive to others who may wish an opportunity for silence to pray and otherwise to prepare for worship.

LIFE THOUGHTS: With Saints Peter and John, we confess Jesus Christ alone as "Author of life" (Acts 3:15). This means no one else has right or responsibility to decide what kind of life a neighbor may have or when any human life ought to end. Rather, we rejoice to repeat the message of repentance and forgiveness (Luke 24:47) for every sinner and every sin, abortion and assisted suicide included.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS: "Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2). Our becoming like our Lord essentially is our sanctification, which, as St. John notes, will only be completed in the Resurrection. But, in the meantime, we strive toward that goal because we want to walk in the footsteps of our Lord. By His grace, we share His life for eternity, and so we try to share His life of service now.

AS YOU DEPART, please be mindful of those who are ushered out behind you, who may have difficulty standing and waiting, and so who need an open path to the door and to get to their cars quickly.
