

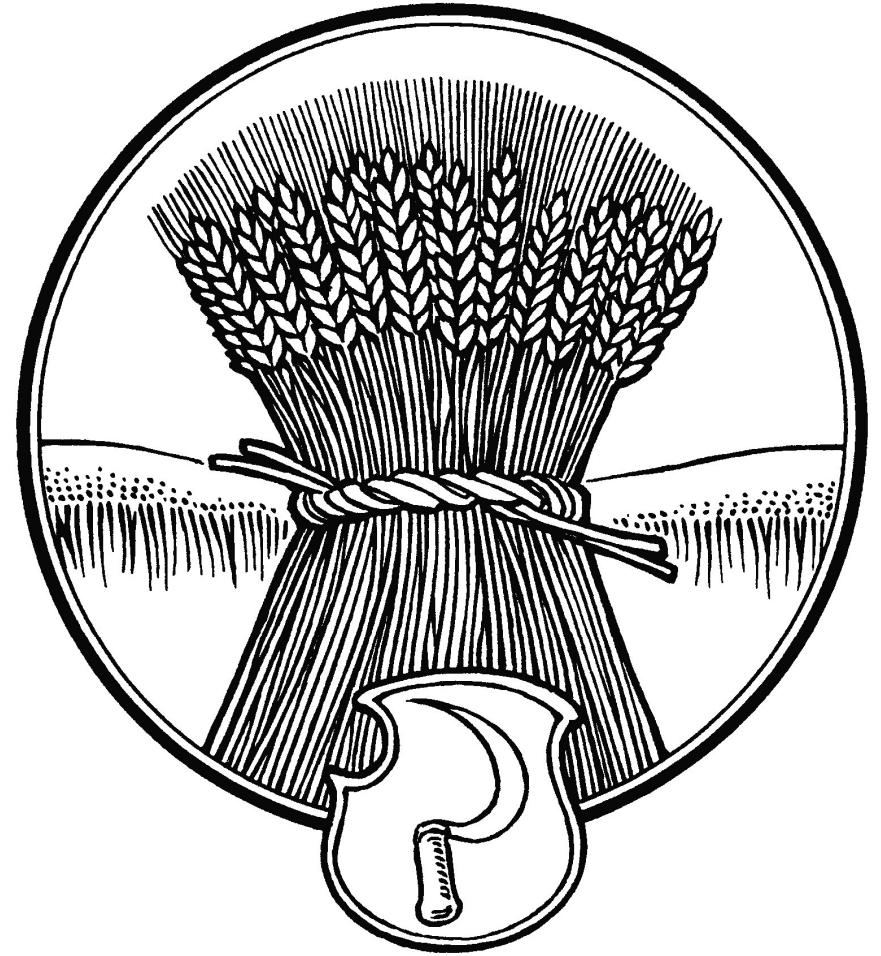

**PILGRIM LUTHERAN CHURCH WELCOMES YOU HERE!** We are pleased that you have come to receive God's gift of forgiveness. Pentecost and the Sundays after Pentecost emphasize the work of the Holy Spirit through God's Word and Sacraments in growing the Church, so we especially invite you to join us in our Bible Classes, as well as in all of our other activities. If you have no church home, you are cordially invited to consider making Pilgrim Lutheran Church your church home!

**AS YOU ARRIVE**, please move down the pew towards the wall, in order to leave room for others. If you arrive late, please wait for an appropriate time to enter the sanctuary, such as during a hymn. Please also remember to turn off your cell phones and/or any other electronic devices. Thank you!

**ORDER OF SERVICE:** To your right you will find today's order of service. The right side of that outline indicates from where the item listed comes: either in this bulletin or the hymnal, *Lutheran Service Book*, with the Psalms towards the front, its liturgical pages towards the middle, and its hymns towards the back. The  $\Delta$  symbol before a hymn stanza indicates that it especially gives glory to the Triune God; we stand before singing the stanza and, in most cases, conclude the stanza by singing "Amen.", if an "Amen" is not already included.

**HOLY COMMUNION:** At Pilgrim we value your presence among us and love and care about our guests and visitors! However, due to the sad divisions that exist in the world and even in Christianity, we cannot commune everyone at the Lord's Table here. We respectfully ask that guests and visitors who desire to commune first speak with the pastor well before the service. All those present but not communing still may approach the rail for a blessing: come forward and kneel with those who are communing, but fold your arms over your heart and place your hands on the opposite shoulders. **INDIVIDUAL CUPS:** The top of the tray contains several individual cups of highly-diluted wine. If you receive the blood of Christ in an individual cup, please be sure to wait to consume it until Pastor comes by with the chalice, so that he knows you are receiving it in that fashion. If the supply of individual cups is depleted, please accept the blood of Christ from the chalice.

**PEW CUSHIONS:** If you would like to use a cushion either for your seat or for your seat and back, cushions for your use are available in the Usher's Closet off the north side of the Narthex.

**PEW SLIPS:** *Visitors*, please register your attendance both by completing a slip from rack on the back of the pews and placing them in the Offering Box in the Narthex and by signing the Guest Register at the door. *Members*, please complete a slip only if your contact information has changed or you have a new or updated prayer-list request. (The Usher tracks church attendance and communion participation.)

**LAST WEEK:** There were 0 students but 1 teacher prepared for Sunday School; 14 people were present in-person for Adult Bible Class, and 2 devices were connected via Jitsi; 39 people were present in-person for the Sunday Divine Service (23 communed), and 5 devices streamed the Service live via YouTube; 1 person was present in-person for Midweek Bible Study, and 5 devices were connected via Jitsi; 0 catechumens participated via Jitsi Thursday afternoon (1 was there to observe); and 3 catechumens were present for in-person catechesis Thursday evening. (The Tuesday and Thursday adult catechumen was not able to meet last week.)

**SERVING TODAY:** The Rev. Dr. Jayson S. Galler, Pastor; Carl Gardner, Elder on Duty; and Elaine Navaille, Accompanist.

**LIFE THOUGHTS:** The Lord bore the people of Israel on eagles' wings and brought them to Himself and wanted them to be His treasured possession (Exodus 19:2-8). Also we are His people and the sheep of His pasture (Psalm 100). While we were still weak and sinners, God showed His love for us by having Christ die for us (Romans 5:6-15). And, He sends out under-shepherds for those who are harassed and helpless (Matthew 9:35-10:20). Loved and forgiven by God, we likewise love and forgive all.

**STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS:** The Divinely-inspired St. Paul writes that "The free gift is not like the trespass" (Romans 5:6-15). Unlike the trespass that resulted in death's spreading to all, the free gift by the grace of Jesus Christ abounds to many for life. Those receiving the free gift in turn support the work of those sent to deliver it to them (Matthew 9:35-10:20). The Greek word that the ESV translates "without paying/pay" really means "freely" in the sense of "undeservedly". The worker deserves his wages (1 Timothy 5:18), whether room and board then, or salary and benefits now.

**AS YOU DEPART**, please be mindful of those who are ushered out behind you, who may have difficulty standing and waiting, and so who may need an open path to the door and to get to their cars quickly. If you stop to talk to someone in the Sanctuary, please keep the aisle as clear as possible and please delay lengthier conversations with the pastor until after he has greeted everyone. Thank you for your consideration!
